## Why I Am and Will Remain a *United Methodist Pastor*

**Over** the course of the last several months I have participated in many conversations with clergy and laity regarding the issues that surround our church's future. Almost always the topic of conversation leads me to share why I am a United Methodist Pastor or if I will remain a United Methodist Pastor after the Special Called General Conference in February. While I could write several pages regarding my rationale behind my decision to remain a United Methodist Pastor, I will just share with you a few reasons.

When my family moved to Man, my Great Aunt introduced me to the United Methodist Church. The people of Bruce McDonald UMC not only welcomed me but embraced me from the start. The people nurtured me in my faith and helped me understand the unconditional love of God. They supported me in my ministry as a youth and even later during my seminary years. We worked together to draw people to the love of God. Sometimes we didn't live up to each other's expectations and in love forgave each other. We didn't always agree on matters of theology or how we practiced our faith, but we always were able to put aside our differences and work together for God's kingdom. They cried with me at my lowest times and celebrated with me during high times. They always encouraged me to do my best but reminded me that no matter what I was loved by them and especially by

God. It was during these times that I learned that church was more than a place of worship. Church was family!

When I was ordained in the United Methodist Church, I entered in covenant with hundreds of clergy and laity throughout the annual conference. Throughout the years I have realized that this covenant was more than just a connection. In fact, the clergy and laity of the annual conference became my family too. Each year in June we gather for a few days to worship, learn, and grow in our relationship with God and with one another. It is like a family reunion! I hear laughter. I witness expressions of love. I watch as people reconnect and share their joys and sorrows. Annual Conference is a place where the people called Methodists gather as the Body of Christ.

It is also during this time at our annual gathering that we do the work of the church. We don't always agree on how we are to do Christ's work nor do we always agree on every theological matter. However, we do our best to put aside our different theological persuasions and do what we think is best for the Kingdom of God. John Wesley said, "In essentials, unity; In non-essentials, liberty; and in all things, charity". In other words, John Wesley believed there were core fundamental religious truths, necessary for our salvation, that must be preserved. He also believed that it was necessary for the church to allow for differing theological persuasions on matters that were not essential. And, he was clear that everything must be done in love. For Wesley, the crucial matter in religion was steadfast love for God and neighbor, empowered by the redeeming and sanctifying work of the Holy Spirit.

This, my friends, is the beautiful thing about our denomination. We are not told how to think or what to believe. Every year at Annual Conference we are provided a place to discuss our differences, discern the fresh winds of the Spirit, and make decisions accordingly. Likewise, every four years clergy and lay representatives across the denomination gather at General Conference to discern the Spirit's direction for the church and adopt denominational guidelines so that each local church can live out Christ's command to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of

the world. In other words, our governing body's role is to provide a structure within the denomination to freely carry the Good News of Jesus Christ into each individual church's context of ministry. I am thankful for this structure because it allows the Holy Spirit to work in the life of the church continually. Without this structure and forum for Holy Conversations to take place, I would not be permitted to serve as a pastor nor would African Americans and women. In all this, one thing is certain and that is this – the church is always in flux! Nothing is finite in our denomination and our structure allows God's Spirit to move within the denomination freely. In the meantime, our denomination will continue to embrace different theological persuasions and every four years discern how best to fulfill the great commission.

While there is much more I could say, I will conclude with this. I love my Church and find it to be a place where I can freely serve my God and Savior. I love my Church because I am given the freedom to express my faith as the Holy Spirit leads me. I love my Church because it provides a forum to discuss my theological differences and grow from those conversations. I love my Church because it is my family. I love my Church because I see the difference the Church makes in the lives of people. I love my Church because it provides us the opportunity to introduce people to Jesus and grow as disciples together. And, while I might not agree with the decisions of the special called General Conference, I will still love my Church! I love my Church and I will always be a United Methodist.




