ent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays (Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter"), which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word *lencten*, which means "spring." The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry. Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In

the early church, Lent was a time

to prepare new converts for baptism. Today, many Christians focus on their relationship with God, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of themselves for others. During our worship service on Ash Wednesday you will be invited to "observe a holy Lent:

by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's Holy word."

While you may be aware of this season leading up to Easter, you may wonder how you might "observe a holy Lent".
While there is no prescribed way

to "observe a holy Lent", practicing any Spiritual Discipline (prayer, study, fasting, confession, service, worship, etc.) is a means through which we confront our sinfulness, remember our mortality, and give thanks for the gift of salvation we receive through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is my hope that you will find some means during this Lenten season to renew your relationship with Jesus Christ and grow in your faith!

Outreach Ministry Need You!

he Outreach Ministry at St. John's mission is to restore hope and provide opportunities for people to become all that God intends them to be. To put our Christian Faith into action through service to the community and to love our neighbor.

Our mission focus is serving the most vulnerable children, teens, and families in Putnam County.

In an effort to do just this, one of our ministries is mentoring children voluntarily in the Juvenile Drug Court Program in Putnam County. We also have a church member that councils and mentors the parents and or guardians.

There are more male children in the program than male mentors. The program is in need of more mentors.

It's a weekly commitment and sometimes it's not easy. You have to be willing to go with the flow. There may be some disappointments. But, we have seen that the program does work.

So, what do you have to do?

We need mentors who can be a friend, not a parent or authority figure. Help them realize their potential. Be positive and give encouragement. Be a good listener. Don't pass judgment. Respect the process. Be that person who takes the initiative to keep in contact with your mentee. Have patience. Most of these children have trust issues. Be willing to take the time, as long as that is to gain their trust. Be confidential. Have fun! One on one or fun group activities help build relationships. But, most of all let them see the light of Christ through your kindness and presence.

Place this on your heart and pray. Maybe, God is calling you to be a part of this ministry.
